Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been lovely to see the children returning to school in such a positive way this week. I have been really impressed by the behaviour of the children and the calm learning environments established by our hard working staff. I look forward to seeing what we can all accomplish together this year, in partnership with our families.

## Speed Survey and parking

Faye Southgate, one of our parents, and I met with the Bucklesham Parish Council and Suffolk County Council to discuss a reduction to the speed on the Brightwell Road (currently 60mph) in August. The County Council have agreed that they will pay for and conduct a speed survey by attaching a device to the school warning sign on the road between  $5^{th} - 16^{th}$  October to measure the speeds, and this will generate a report which will identify next steps, if they are needed.

Can I take this opportunity to remind all parents that you can not park on the yellow zigzag lines outside of school, as this needs to be left free for emergency vehicles, also the bus stop, as it is for buses only. I would rather you were late picking your child up because you have had to park further away from school and walk, than you parking unsafely and causing an accident where a child or parent were hurt. We did have some incidents last year where parents had their foot run over by another car and children narrowly missed being hit. Please park and drive safely.

## **School Uniform**

There is a new charity based in Felixstowe, Pushchair Pitstop, that is tackling uniform poverty in the Felixstowe area, including for Bucklesham families. They are looking for donations of unwanted uniform in good condition to pass onto families. Our BSA also collects uniform to sell at their events for a small charge, to support families and reduce waste. If any parents are in a position where they are in need of support for uniform, please contact the school office or myself. There is a simple form you can fill in to request uniform from Pushchair Pitstop and also for support in buying new school shoes.

## **Curriculum Enrichment**

Next Friday 15<sup>th</sup> is <u>National Dot Day</u>, which is linked to a book called 'The Dot', which is all about having a growth mindset and believing that you can do anything you set your mind to. Having a growth mindset is something that we are encouraging all of our children to develop, as this will make them more resilient and able to take risks, and learn from their mistakes. Children can wear non uniform for the day if it contains something dotty – this is optional and children can opt to wear their normal school uniform.
