This includes a list of infectious diseases and the recommendation to keep a child off with a high temperature of over 38 °C. There is no longer any requirement to test for Covid, but to keep them off if they are unwell with a high temperature.

Celebration Assembly


Willow class shared their family trees they had made.


Oak class shared their Science work on parts of a plant and their sunflowers they have planted.
